1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To obtain the sub-committee's decision in respect of an application to transfer the Premises Licence and vary the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) for Rogalik, 51 Midland Road, Wellingborough, Northamptonshire, NN8 1HF.

2. Executive Summary

2.1 The application to transfer the Premises Licence and vary the named DPS, has attracted a representation against the transfer and variation of the licence. The report sets out the background to the issue and invites the sub-committee to determine the application.

3. Recommendations

3.1 The sub-committee is recommended to consider whether to grant the applications as requested.

4. Report Background

- 4.1 Applications have been submitted to transfer the Premises Licence and to vary the DPS for Rogalik, 51 Midland Road, Wellingborough. The full details are included within the application forms included in Appendix A.
- 4.2 Following consultation, a representation was received from the Police against granting the applications. This representation is included within Appendix B. The representation objects on the grounds that the licensing objective, as prescribed by Section 4(2) of the Act, is not likely to be met. The relevant licensing objective is;
 - the prevention of crime and disorder

5. Issues and Choices

- 5.1 The representation from the Police details a visit undertaken on 3rd March 2020 when tobacco products were found on the premises for which the required duty had not been paid. A test purchase visit undertaken on 14th April 2020 is also detailed, during which a plain clothed Police Officer purchased a packet of Russian cigarettes. The applicant who has requested to become the licence holder and named DPS was managing the premises at the time of these visits.
- 5.2 The Police submitted an application to review the premises licence in August 2020, as a consequence of these visits. This application was considered by the Licensing Sub-Committee for Borough Council of Wellingborough on 19th October 2020. A copy of the decision notice is included within Appendix C.
- 5.3 The licence holder has submitted an appeal to the magistrates court against this decision. The appeal hearing is still to be heard, so the outcome is currently pending and the premises is trading as normal pending the outcome of the appeal.
- 5.4 It is the opinion of the police that granting the application to transfer the premises licence and vary the DPS to the individual who was managing the premises at the time of the above incidents, would undermine the crime and disorder licensing objective.
- 5.5 Members should be mindful of the guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 by the Secretary of State, which provides guidance on the powers of the licensing authority on the determination of applications.
- 5.6 Members should also take into consideration the councils Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 5.7 Whilst having regard to the information provided by the applicant, the representation and also the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy, the Sub-Committee's decision must be made with a view to promoting the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective.

- 6.2.2 In accordance with the provisions of the Act, if a Licensing Authority rejects an application to transfer a Premises Licence or vary a DPS, the applicant may appeal against the decision, to a Magistrates' court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.

Subject: Premises Licence Transfer and Vary DPS application, Rogalik, 51, Midland Road, Wellingborough, NN8 1HF.

Dear Mr O'Donnell,

I act on behalf of the Chief Officer of Police for Northamptonshire, Mr Adderley. He has delegated responsibility and authorised me to act on his behalf with regard to representations made by Northamptonshire Police to Licensing Authorities across the county of Northamptonshire.

Northamptonshire Police are objecting to the grant of the above mentioned applications under the Licensing Objective of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, the reasons and rationale are detailed below.

On the 3rd of March 2020, officers from Her Majesties Revenue and Customs (HMRC), Northamptonshire County Council Trading Standards Department, and Northamptonshire Police Licensing Department visited the premises as part of an operation centring on the illegal sale of duty not paid tobacco products. During the visit the services of a tobacco detection dog were employed. The owner of the business who identified himself as Mr Poori was present during the visit however the Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor at the time Mr Tanna was not. In Mr Poori's office situated at the rear of the property the tobacco detection dog made an indication at the rear wall in the office, at the same time scratching noises could be heard coming from behind the wall where a wooden panel and cupboard were situated. The wooden panel was lifted to revel a hidden storage hole/hide that could be accessed via a metal door situated on the outer wall of the property as well as within Mr Poori's office. By this time the compartment area had been cleared, Officers exited the premises and located an alleyway that led to the rear of the premises and seized various tobacco products that had been dropped on the ground when the storage compartment was cleared, no persons were discovered. In addition before leaving the premises an HMRC Officer took the shop keys with them, one of the keys taken fitted the lock of the metal door situated on the outer wall and the keys were the property of Mr Poori.

The items recovered and seized left in the storage area/hide is as follows: 20 **L&M LINK** cigarettes, 20 **PECT** cigarettes.

On the ground in the rear alley, 0.15kg of **AMBERLEAF** hand rolling tobacco, 0.05kg of **GOLDEN VIRGINIA** hand rolling tobacco, 40 **MALBORO WHITE** cigarettes, 40 **MALBORO GOLD** cigarettes, and 40 **PECT** cigarettes. All the seized items were duty not paid tobacco products. On the 14th of April 2020 Northamptonshire Police conducted a Test Purchase at the premises, a packet of Russian labelled cigarettes were sold to a plain clothes police officer for £3.50.

On the 18th of June 2020 Northamptonshire Police wrote to the Premises Licence Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor Mr Tanna detailing the visited in March 2020 and the Test Purchase on the 14th of April 2020. The week commencing the 29th of June 2020 Mr Tanna contacted Northamptonshire Police by phone and spoke with PC 113 Bryan, during this conversation Mr Tanna explained that he had sold the business to Mr Poori and was not the landlord of the property at 51 Midland Road. Mr Tanna explained that he offered to remain the Premises Licence Holder and DPS as Mr Poori did not have a Personal Licence. Mr Tanna went on further to state that he has nothing to do with the business and is not involved in the day to day running of the business.

A Review Hearing of the Premises Licence took place on the 19th of October 2020 after Northamptonshire Police submitted Review papers, Mr Tanna and Mr Poori were present at the hearing and after both sides made their representations the Licensing Sub-committee of the Borough Council of Wellingborough revoked the Premises Licence. The Premises Licence Holder at the time Mr Tanna has appealed this decision to Northamptonshire Magistrates and the case is yet to be heard as of the date of this E-mail.

Northamptonshire Police hold the opinion that to grant the transfer of the Premises Licence and the subsequent vary DPS application would undermine the Licensing Objective of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the objective would not be promoted.

The Panel carefully deliberated and had regard to:

- The Licensing Act 2003
- The Statement of Licensing Policy
- S182 Guidance
- Borough Council of Wellingborough's Licensing Policy

The reasons for the review was in relation to the failure to promote the licensing objective in relation to prevention of crime and disorder. The Committee took into consideration their obligation to treat the sale or storage of illegal tobacco as a serious criminal activity.

The number of failures to comply with the conditions of the Premises Licence being lack of age verification policy, no incident log, no authorisation process for the sale of alcohol, lack of employee training in licensing matters, partially operative CCTV system and no first aid box, demonstrated a failure to consider public safety in general.

The Premises License Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor failed to demonstrate he had any reasonable control over or connection to the Premises. He also failed to show a basic knowledge of the licensing objectives and his responsibilities under the Licensing Act.

The Panel had seriously considered the options available to them and received the appropriate legal advice. It was considered not appropriate to merely modify the conditions of the license. A suspension of the license was deemed inappropriate as the Committee was not satisfied that doing so would prompt a change in the operation of the Premises, due to the ongoing lack of management control.

It is for that reason that the Committee, decided unanimously that it is appropriate and proportionate to revoke the Premises Licence.
