

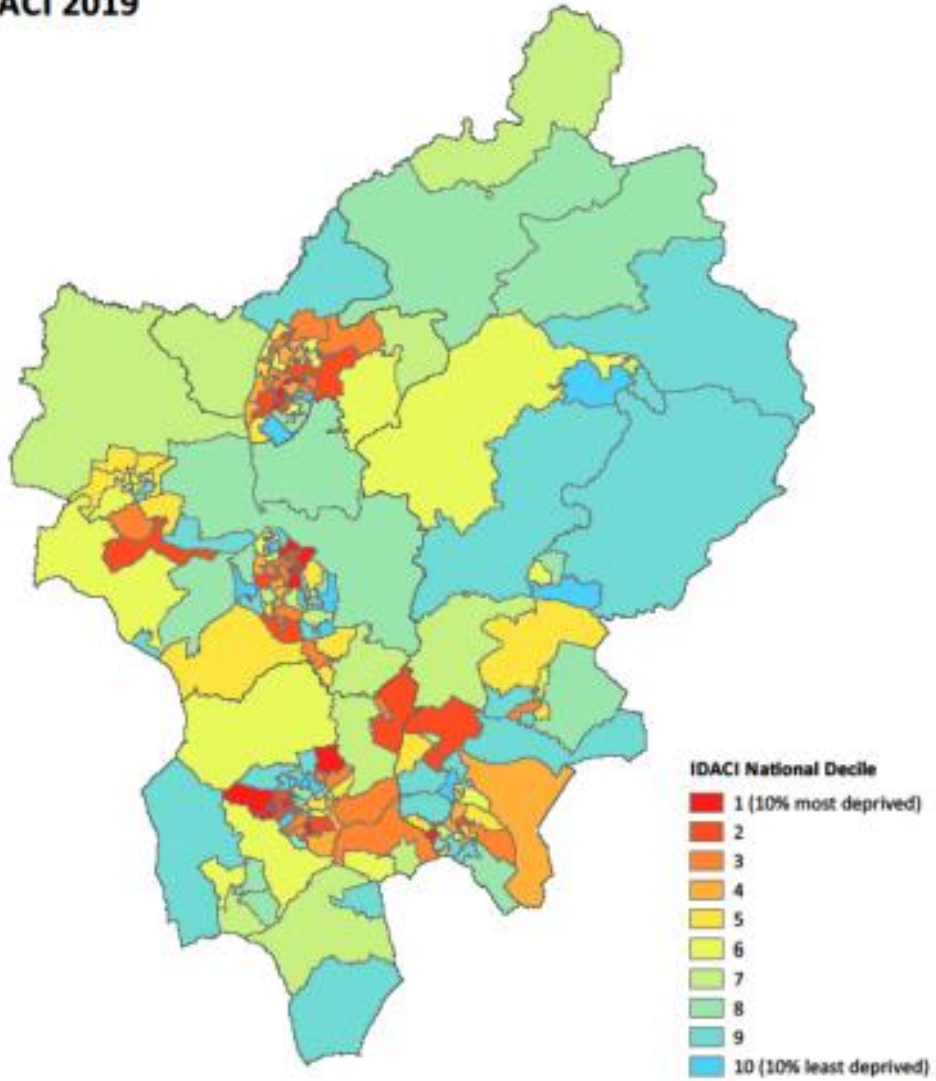

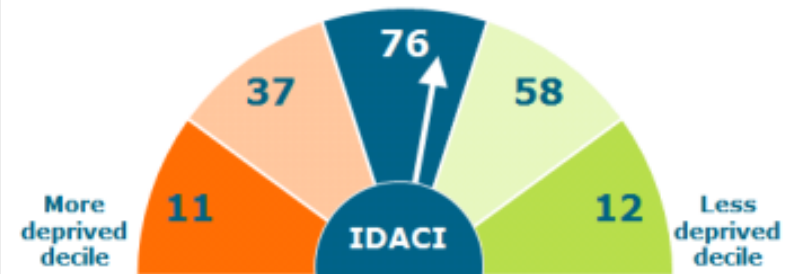

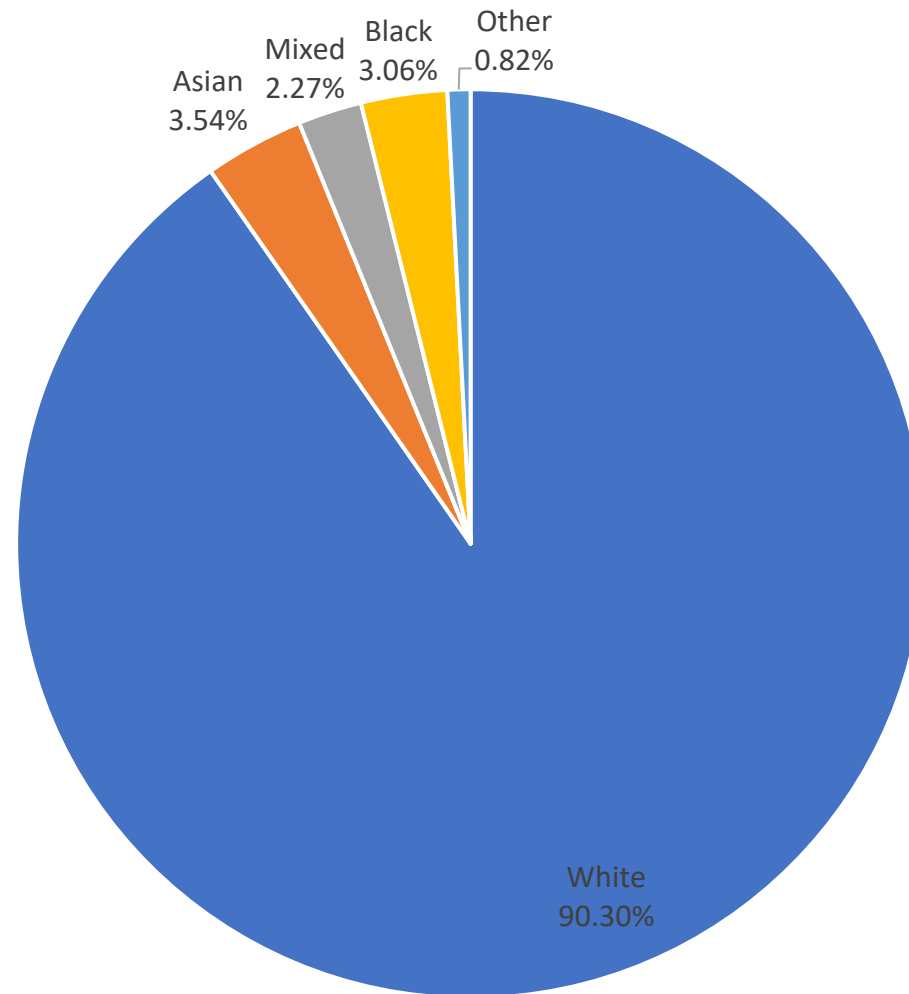
- North Northamptonshire was created on 1 April 2021 by the merger of the four districts:

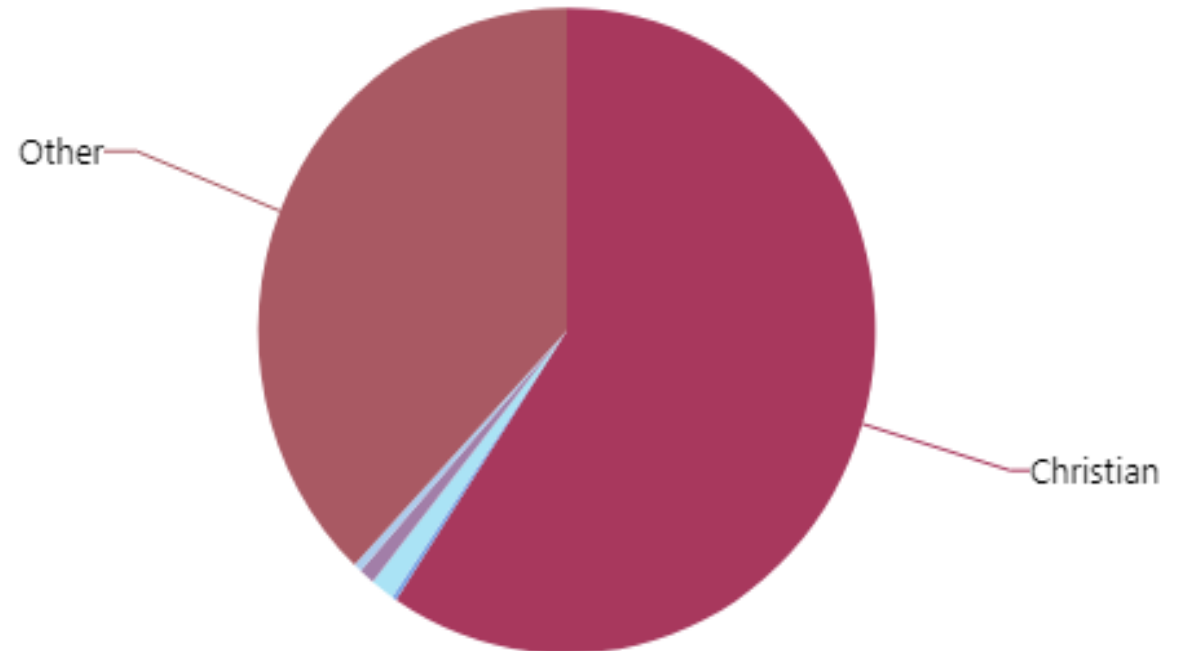

A child is considered to be growing up in poverty if they live in a household whose income is below 60% of the average (median) income for that year. This is called 'relative poverty'. Data on relative child poverty is available both before and after housing costs are taken into account.

Mental Health and Well being Headlines

A local audit of Coroner's records for **deaths due to suicide** during the period Sept 2017 - Aug 2019 identified **physical illness** or deterioration, **mental illness**, **debt** and **financial problems**, **work stress** and **relationship breakdown** as crisis triggers in the files examined.

The most prevalent social factors in the deaths examined were being **socially isolated** and having **adverse childhood experiences**, including parental relationship breakdown and being in care.



In 2018, the rate of long term unemployment was **2.9 per 1,000** working age population.



In 2017/18, **1.7%** of households were living in temporary accommodation.



In 2017/18, the rate of domestic abuse related crime reported to the police was **26.8 per 1,000** population.



In 2018/19, the rate of violent crime offences reported to the police was **27.0 per 1,000** population.



In 2017, **8.1%** households were in fuel poverty.

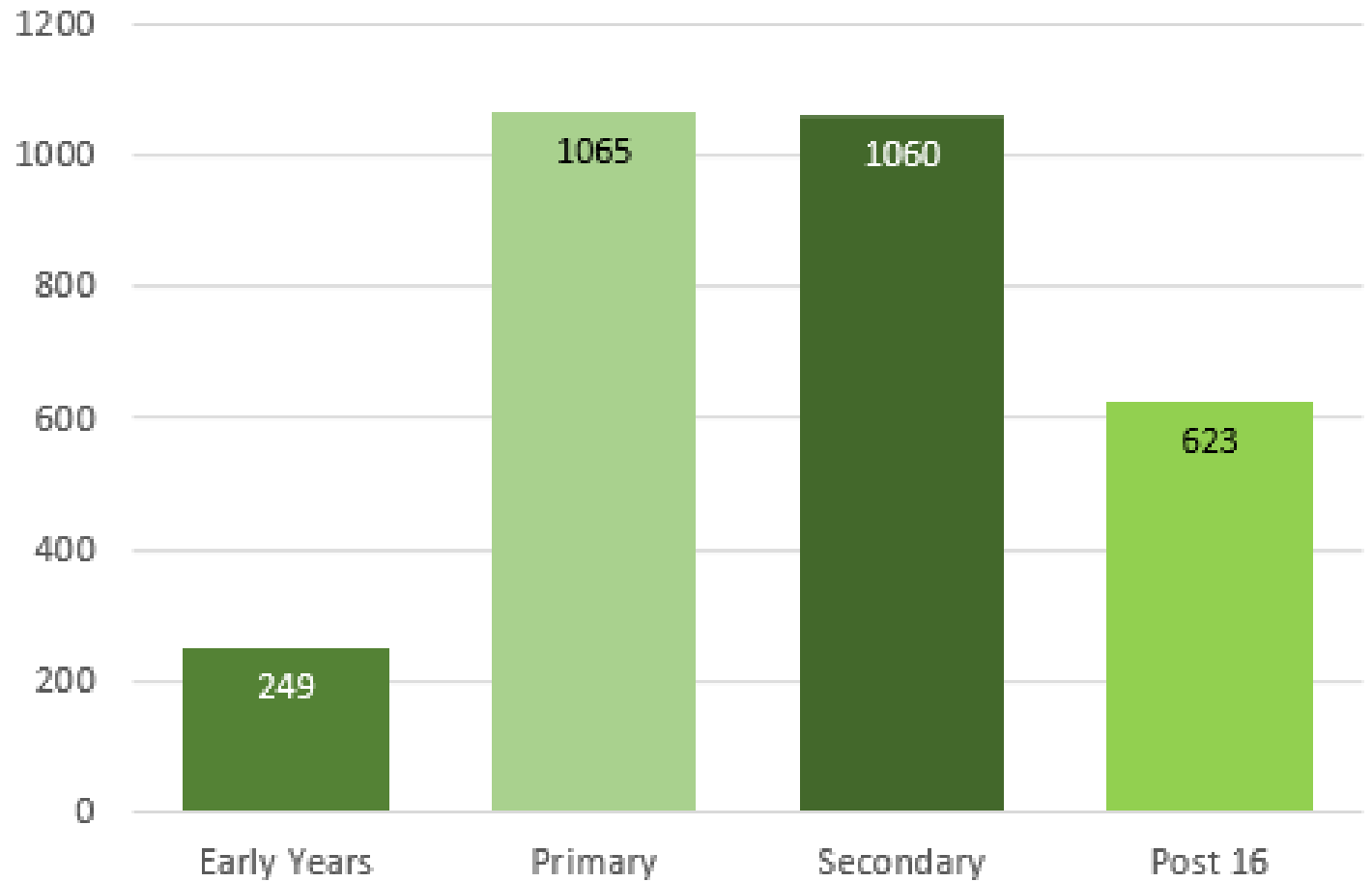

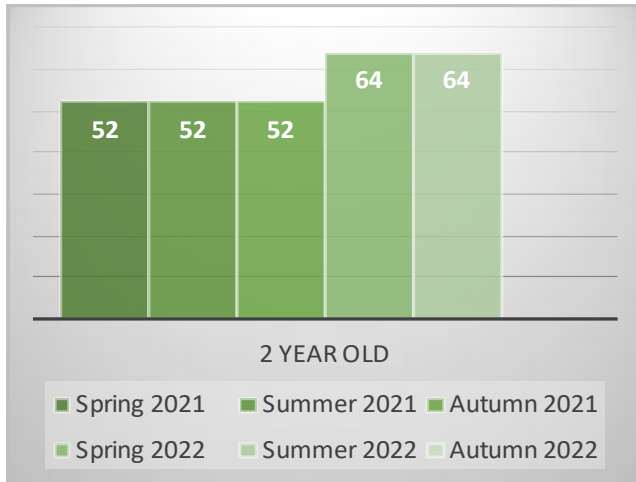

- The number of children in receipt of DAF claims has almost tripled in the last year with a total of 31 children now in receipt of funding
- Whilst there are sufficient places for children to take up their free entitlements currently, changes are coming from September 2023 which may impact the sector and create challenge within the market

Good Level of Development Summary

Children are defined as having reached a Good Level of Development (GLD) at the end of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) if they have achieved at least the expected level for the Early Learning Goals in the prime areas of learning and the specific areas of mathematics and literacy. This helps teachers and parents to understand broadly what a child can do in relation to national expectations.

- North Northants (NN) pupil outcome data is below national in all areas with Wellingborough being below both national and North Northants averages overall.
- Communication and language overall achievement in North Northants (NN) was 77.9% with national at 79.5% and Wellingborough reaching 73.3%.
- Early communication and engagement is central to learning, interaction, well-being, and life chances. The impact of the pandemic on our youngest children has been significant, however historical GLD data shows that Wellingborough has been below national since 2016. Wellingborough has also been significantly below the other locality areas in North Northants regarding GLD outcomes since 2016.

Reading, Writing and Maths

Wellingborough outcomes for Reading, Writing and Maths at the end of Key Stage 1 sit below NN outcomes. Therefore, the gap between Wellingborough and national is as follows in reading, writing and maths:

- Gap Reading: 6%
- Gap Writing: 4.7%
- Gap Maths: 5.9%

Whilst Corby is also lower than national in reading, writing and maths by the end of Key Stage 1, the gap is very slightly less than that of Wellingborough.

Kettering and East Northants locality areas are either broadly in line with national or slightly above by the end of Key Stage 1 in these 3 key areas.

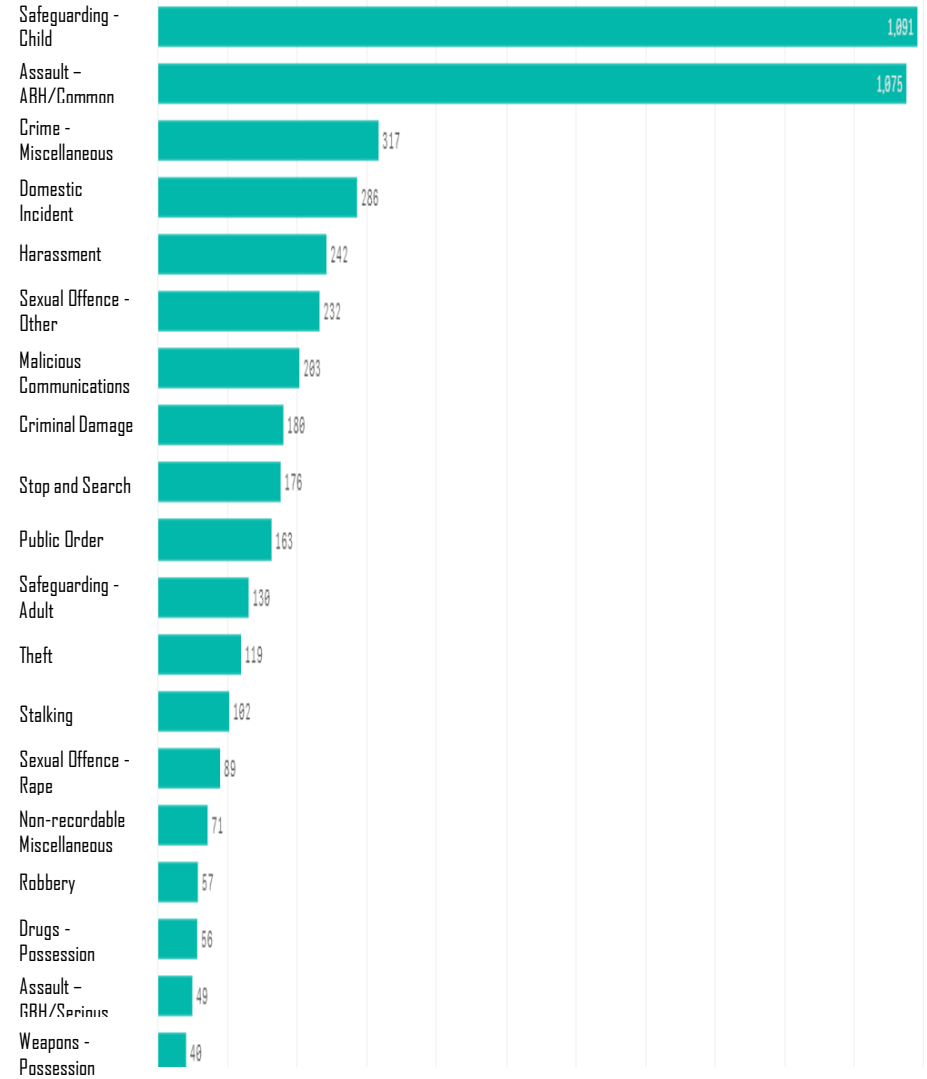
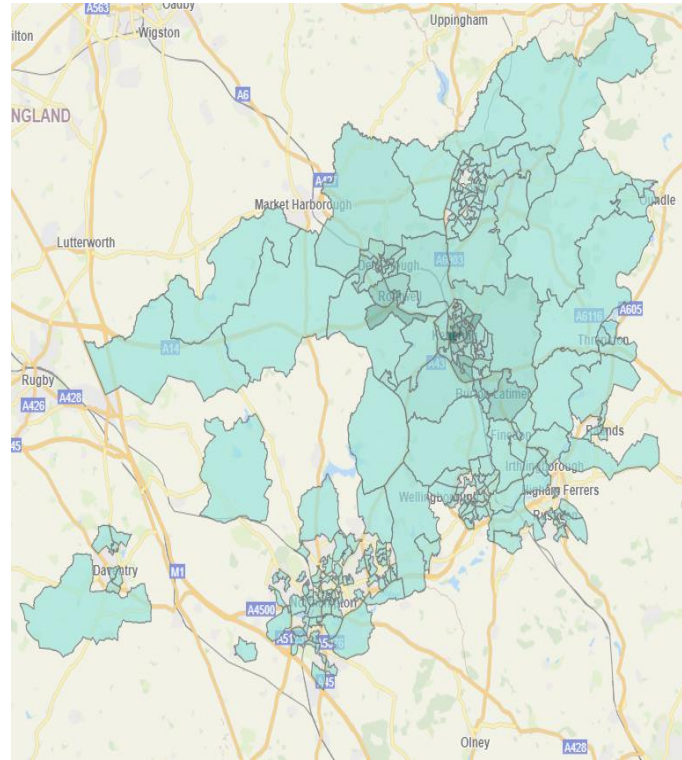


Good Level of Development DATA 2021/2022

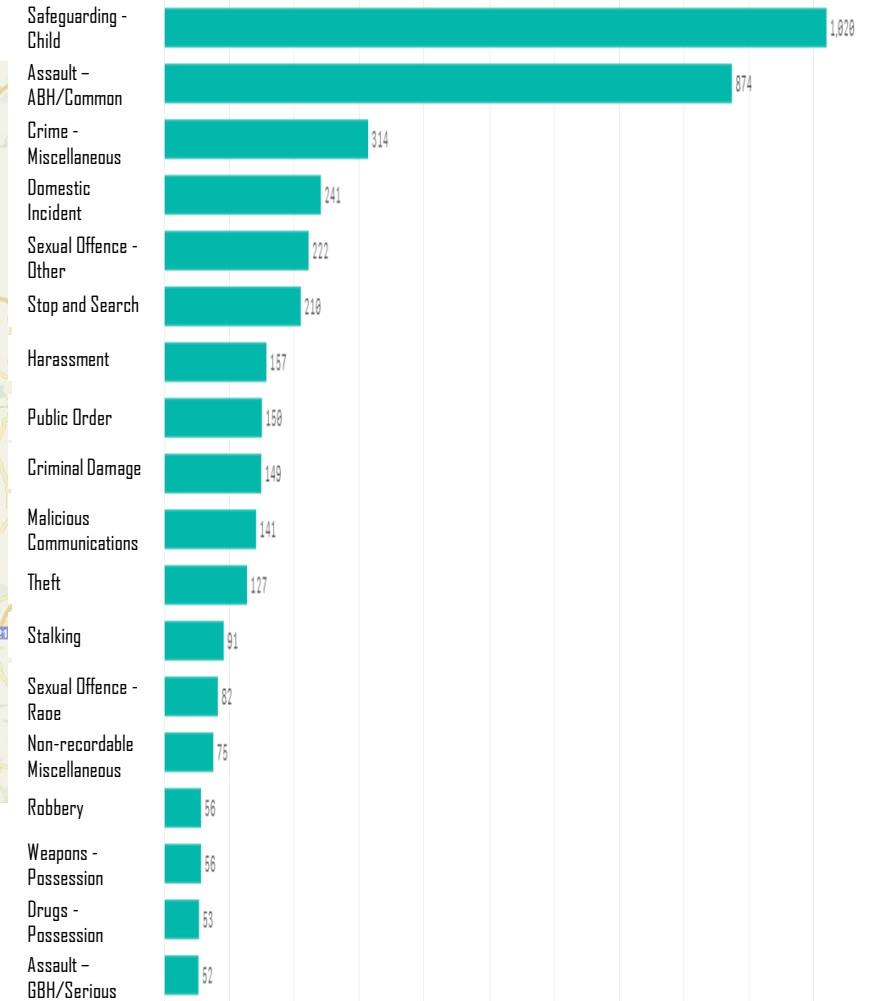
Where Individuals Live Within Northamptonshire
