 Initial funding has been received and a further amount is anticipated to be released soon to enable the LNRS work to progress at pace

• There is now a **secondment** in place to focus on the LNRS and the related workstream on Biodiversity Net

Working Group 1 – Land Managers

Purpose: Engagement with landowners and tenants

Purpose: Engagement with community/parish groups via consultations, communication etc



Stakeholder Engagement

- Production of a Stakeholder Engagement Plan
 - Early steps with NRT and WLT
 - Stakeholders need to be identified
 - Engagement strategy for different stakeholders
 - Change over time
 - Need to consult with adjoining responsible authorities



Mapping

- There is a requirement to map areas of biodiversity importance.
 - This is prescriptive so that there is a common base across the country
- Map areas that are or could be of particular importance for biodiversity following stakeholder engagement
