Hello Ian,

Here you go.

At 00:30 on 19/05/2024 Police received a report from a member of the public stating that there was a large fight occurring outside THE WHITE HART PUBLIC HOUSE in CORBY with several people injured at the scene. Officers arrived shortly afterwards with numerous walking wounded around the area and one adult male laying on the floor in the doorway of the pub with a significant laceration to the back of his head. Officers were advised that the offenders had fled from the pub towards the train station but due to the risk of the male with the head laceration the decision was made to remain and ensure that he was cared for while another crew was requested to attend and search for any offenders.

It was stated by people at the scene that several people had attended the pub for a night out, and that one of them had exited the front of the pub and had begun to urinate up the wall outside. A member of staff at the pub challenged the male outside about this, the male became instantly aggressive and proceeded to throw the member of staff into the doorway of the pub. The noise from the commotion led to numerous other people including several friends of the male urinating coming outside of the pub and engaging in a fight. Prior to any Police arrival, all of the believed group fled the scene and were not present. None of the people reporting assaults were able to identify any of the suspects involved in the incident, and none of them were able to specifically identify which of the males had assaulted them. None of the witnesses were able to provide any specific details or name any of the persons involved.

The premises has alcohol sales until midnight and close of business at 12:30am Mon-Sun, although there were persons still present at 00:30am this would have been within the terms of the licence it has not be ascertained whether the premises were operating outside of this, or closing down for the evening.

There have been no recorded licensing issues made to the police since the 19/05/2024 and the police licensing database has been searched to the beginning of 2024 with no recorded incidents at the premises.
