Objection on the Grounds of Public Nuisance.

My wife and I live only 100-150yds away from what was Corby Rugby Club, the venue for this application. We live at Corby Tennis Centre, and have done so since 1991.

When the current owners took over the premises, we had enormous issues with the noise coming from the venue until the early hours of the morning. The volume of the 'music' was so loud (especially the base), that we could not hear our television in our own lounge. It was impossible to go to sleep while an event was taking place. It was with massive relief when they stopped having late night/morning events.

I tried to explain to the then owner (who I believe is still the same person) about the impact the events were having, but he refused to help with the volume at all. He also threatened to make the events nightly if I complained to the local authority. We did contact the police and local authority about the detrimental impact the events at Corby Rugby Club were having on us, as I had no choice. We made recording notes on the Noise App, as it was so ridiculously loud. He also stated that he didn't realise anyone lived at Corby Tennis Centre, but we have been here since October 1991, and he does now. We also now have our 18 month old grandson stay overnight with us, and these events would undoubtedly prevent him from being able to sleep, as they propose to go on until 2.30am.

We also had the issue of the public being drunk and disorderly when leaving the premises. Often, they walk along Jimmy Kane Way, and across the playing field to get to their destination, so passing the front of the Tennis Centre. They were often very loud, urinating in our car park, fighting etc, so also being a public nuisance.

My wife and I very strongly object to Prospect Brigstock Limited being allocated a license to stage these late night events, and/or sell alcohol. I sincerely hope you will not put our physical and mental health at risk by allowing this license to be granted.
