

Guidance for making decisions affecting Members and Officers

- 1. The Council has agreed to the following principles of decision making within its Constitution:
 - Make sure that the action we are taking is proportionate to the results we need to achieve
 - b. Make sure that we consult where appropriate to do so
 - c. Respect human rights
 - d. Ensure that the decision represents best value for North Northamptonshire
 - e. Ensure that we are open and transparent in the way we make decisions
 - f. Be clear about what we are trying to achieve and what the outcomes will be
 - g. Consider whether an alternative option is more appropriate
 - h. Give reasons for why we have made decisions
- 2. The Officer Scheme of Delegation provides authority for officers to make executive and non-executive decisions. The Scheme is to be interpreted widely to give effect to the overall purpose of a streamlined, clear and simple decision- making process. Decisions will be recorded and published in accordance with constitutional and legislative requirements.
- 3. There are restrictions to using delegated authority and these are;
 - a. For any matter which by law may not be delegated to an Officer
 - b. Which is specifically excluded from the delegation by the Scheme or a decision of a member decision making body
 - c. Where the Head of Paid Service, the Monitoring Officer or the Chief Finance Officer has given a direction
 - d. Any Key Decision
- 4. It should be noted that there is already a specific restriction on using delegated authority for planning matters where;
 - a. A member makes an application
 - b. A member's direct family makes an application, and the member has a financial interest
 - c. Where an officer of the Planning and Development Service make an application
 - d. Where an officer (at Tier 4 or above) makes an application
 - e. Where an officer's (at Tier 4 or above) direct family makes an application and the officer has a financial interest
- 5. The Monitoring Officer has advised that where decisions are made which impact elected members and senior officers (at Tier 4 or above), in some instances it is appropriate that delegated authority is not exercised, and the decision shall be escalated to the relevant decision-making body.
- 6. This Guidance shall not limit members/officers' ability to easily access the same services as any other resident of North Northamptonshire and therefore routine transactions are able to be undertaken using delegated authority.

- 7. Routine transactions will likely be decisions where officers are following agreed processes and procedures or decisions where annual/set fees and charges will be applied. Examples include but are not limited to;
 - a. Applications for green waste collection
 - b. Applications for allocation of housing/garages
 - c. Applications for social care
- 8. Transactions which will normally be escalated to the relevant decision-making body will likely be;
 - a. where an officer exercises discretion outside of agreed processes/procedures whether to make a decision
 - b. Where an officer determines the terms of an agreement and there will be a financial impact
 - c. Where rights and liberties of the officer/member may be affected
 - d. Where there could be a perception that members/officers could be seeking an advantage/disadvantage through their position or influence
 - e. Examples include but are not limited to;
 - commercial leases/licences
 - contractual agreements
- 9. Advice must be sought from the Monitoring Officer on the interpretation of this Guidance and/or the Officer Scheme of Delegation where officers have queries.
